**Local Equalization Board Meeting Minutes  
North Sioux City, South Dakota**

**March 19, 2018**

The City Council for North Sioux City convened as the Local Board of Equalization. The meeting was called to order at 6:23 p.m. Those in attendance were Beavers, Berg, Christiansen (6:25 p.m.), Cropley, Green, Parks, Reiff, Slater, Mayor Fredericksen, and Corey Reiff, representing Dakota Valley School Board.

The board heard the following appeals to correct their 2018 real estate assessment. Each applicant was given a handout outlining Union County's appeal process. Appellant was advised the local board is the first step in the appeal process. Information provided the local board will be forwarded on to the Assessor's office.

Property/Parcel: 210 Victor Ave / 05.01.04.1015  
Current Valuation: Land: \$14,685 Buildings: \$52,094 Total: \$66,779  
Owner present: Bev Green

Request: Mrs. Green stated there had been two increases in four years, \$9,579 and \$7,929, with no changes to the structure. Applicant requests building assessment be returned to prior year's amount of \$44,165.

Motion by Beavers second by Cropley to leave land value at \$14,685 and recommend changing building value to \$44,165 for a total assessment of \$58,850. Green abstained. Remaining board members present voted aye.

Current Valuation: Land: \$7,920 Buildings: \$131,489 Total: \$139,409  
Owner present: Allen Fredericksen

Request: Fredericksen stated he has a Governor's home and a basement totaling \$70,000. He has finished the basement and built a detached garage. Fredericksen states the location and valuation of property on his street do not match. He related the property at 112 Lloyd sold at \$67,000 and that his home would not sell at the price it is assessed. Fredericksen asked for the structure to be reduced to \$90,080.

Motion by Cropley second by Beavers to recommend reducing the building value from \$131,489 to \$101,680 for a total of \$109,600. All board members present voted aye.

As the roll was reviewed, Kloostra related Finance Assistant Roupe reported three structures no longer exist need to be removed from North Sioux City's roll: 1) 111 Wallace, 2) 113 Wallace, and 3) 622 Lakeshore. Motion by Berg second by C. Reiff to approve the roll with the removal of three properties. All board members present voted aye.

Motion by Parks second by Cropley to adjourn at 6:50 p.m. All board members present voted aye.

**City Council Regular Meeting Minutes**  
March 19, 2018

Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m. by Mayor Fredericksen. Beavers, Berg, Christiansen, Cropley, Green, Parks, Slater and Reiff were present. Also in attendance were City Administrator Ted Cherry and Finance Officer Susan Kloostra.

Mayor Fredericksen welcomed Cub Scout Pack 28 to the City Council Meeting. Mayor asked the scouts to come forward and join the Pledge of Allegiance.

A moment of silence was held to honor Chuck Meyer, former City Council and Planning Commission Member, who passed away last week.

Motion by Christiansen second by Cropley to approve the agenda as presented. All members present voted aye.

Motion by Green second by Beavers to approve the March 5 Regular Council Meeting Minutes. All members present voted aye.

The Library Board is advertising for two openings. Once the board reviews letters of interest, recommendations will be made for Council to approve. No action needed at this time.

A local organization, Tri-State Cruisers, is requesting approval to close Military Road to hold a cruise night on September 19, 1p-9p. The Military Road closure would be from Centennial Drive to North Main Street. Traffic would be rerouted and the organization asks the City to be responsible for barricade placement and removal. Motion by Christiansen second by Cropley to approve the road closure as requested. All members present voted aye.

Chief Headid has reported that during a recent audit that National Crime Information Center (NCIC) asked for a new Restricted Access policy for the Police Department. NCIC and the Criminal Justice Information System (CJIS) puts in place a written policy to formalize who and how digital records are accessed. The policy outlines restricted access to records, computer and terminal access, as well as non-employee access. Motion by Christiansen second by Berg to approve the Police department's Restricted Access policy as presented. All members present voted aye.

The Planning Commission approved on March 14 River Valley LLC's request to plat two additional lots. Motion by Beavers second by Reiff to approve the plat as presented. All members present voted aye.

Plat of Lots 82 and 83 Of Tract 4 of River Valley Addition, North Sioux City, Union County, South Dakota

Three easements for Lakeshore Estates were presented for Council's approval. After discussion, the following motions were passed:

Motion by Christiansen second by Reiff to approve the Access and Permanent Utility Easement from Lakeshore Development, Inc. to the City and authorize President Dan Parks to sign the necessary documentation. All members present voted aye.

Utility Easement in Part of Lot A2, Accretion to Lot 8 of Lot D in Government Lot 1, Government Lot 2 and the SE1/4-NW1/4 of Section 15, T89N, R48W of the 5th P.M. City of North Sioux City, Union County, South Dakota.

Motion by Parks second by Reiff to approve the Access and Permanent Utility Easement from Lakeshore Estates, LLL to the City and authorize President Dan Parks to sign the necessary documentation. All members present voted aye.

Utility Easement in Part of Lakeshore Estates First Addition in Lot 7 of Lot D in Government Lot 1, Government Lot 2 and the SE1/4-NW1/4 of Section 15, T89N, R48W of the 5th P.M. City of North Sioux City, Union County, South Dakota.

Motion by Reiff second by Green to approve the Assignment of Developer's Interest In Permanent Utility Easement and authorize President Dan Parks to sign the necessary documentation. All members present voted aye.

The east 40 feet of Lot B in the SE1/4-NE1/4 of Section 15, Township 89 North, Range 48 West of the 5th P.M. lying north of Harm's Subdivision, North Sioux City, Union County, South Dakota.

and

The east 40 feet of the south 163.00 feet of Lot 8 of Lot D in the NW1/4 of Section 15, Township 89 North, Range 48 West of the 5th P.M. lying north of Harm's Subdivision, North Sioux City, Union County, South Dakota, as shown on the Exhibit "A" (two pages) attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof ("Property")

Lakeshore Estates Phase 1 construction documents have been finalized following several meetings, which included City Engineer Greg Meyer. Meyer presented items to be addressed, including the three easements, a right of way agreement on Streeter Drive and the bike trail which would be affected during the sewer line construction. Discussion was held including addressing the second street not coming off Lakeshore. Beaver asked about whether property owners had met with the developers to discuss the property preventing the second access to come off Lakeshore. Cherry stated he believed there has been but had no details. Motion by Christiansen second by Parks to approve the Phase I construction documents of Lakeshore Estates as presented. Aye: Berg, Christiansen, Cropley, Green, Parks, Reiff, Slater. Nay: Beavers. Motion passes 7-1.

At the March 19, 2018 Council meeting, Council approved the Lakeshore Estates Reimbursement Agreement. However, the motion did not include authorization for President Parks to sign the agreement. Slater stated concerns for the procedural change to allow the President to sign documents rather than the Mayor for the Lakeshore Estates documents. Mayor addressed statements asserting he will not sign documents that he does not agree with and further stated he is not against the project but feels taxpayer money should not be ignored. Berg asked for an update regarding the developer and land owners discussion, at a subsequent Council meeting. Parks stated his agreement to sign Phase I documents as it doesn't include the road in question. Motion by Reiff second by Berg to approve President Parks to sign necessary documentation as it relates to the reimbursement agreement. All members present voted aye.

Cherry presented for the Council's review and direction the conceptual design for the new City sign to be placed by Interstate 29, off Exit 2. Input was taken including that the sign doesn't welcome people to the city and the new branding isn't incorporated. Data collection only, no action taken.

The Police Department requests the surplus of the 2009 Chevy Impala VIN 2G1WS57M091262640, along with the attached cage, front push bar bumper, center console, and computer stand. Motion by Beavers second by Parks to approve the 2009 Chevy Impala and attached equipment to be surplus property and to be sold. All members present voted aye.

Community/council input:

- 1) There will be a DVBC Legislative Update on Monday, April 9, at 4:00 p.m. in the Council Chambers. State Elected Representatives will also attend.
- 2) Linda Daugaard will be visiting North Sioux's Community Library on April 19 at 4:00p.m.

- 4) North Sioux's Spring Clean Up is April 14 and 15 with a rain date on April 21. Specifics are listed on water bills and in the paper.
- 5) Beavers addressed Commissioner Headid regarding funding and the county tax levy increase since the City has taken over three roads which the County no longer maintains.
- 6) Christiansen mentioned street signs that have not been replaced after the sign project was complete, such as the children at play signs. Public Works Superintendent Hogan will address any missing signs.

Motion by Parks second by Cropley to enter Executive Session at 7:45 p.m. in accordance with SDCL 1-25-2 (sections 1 and 4) to discuss Personnel matters. All members present voted aye.

Regular session resumed at 8:03 p.m.

Motion by Parks second by Reiff to approve the bills as presented. All members present voted aye.

Re: Splash Pad Update

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**Background:** In the past month there have been ongoing community and Parks Board discussions regarding the splash pad. Those discussions have centered on the location of the pad, parking areas for the visitors to the pad, and about what kind of system would be used to supply the pad with water.

The Parks Board have been working toward placement of the pad in Ferrari Park. The total amount of space needed would be approximately 1,500 sq ft. The board have vetted a water circulation system that would use chlorination, less water, and would not continuously discharge.

A number of pictures have been attached that show possible locations that are currently owned by the City and have been suggestions.


1. The first picture is the proposed location at Ferrari Park. There is approximately 10,000 sq ft available and there is a water line that is available. The area is relatively flat
2. The second picture is of 2 spaces at the library. The back space is approximately 9,700 sq ft and the front approximately 5,700 sq ft. Water would need to be run to either of these locations, but is available from a number of places. The area is relatively flat
3. The third picture is of Parkside Park. The West location would be approximately 5,300 sq ft, but would require the removal of some or all of the existing basketball court. This could be replaced in another location. The East location would be right next to the Police Station and is approximately 4,000 sq ft. Both of these locations have access to water. There would need to be excavation work on each.

The Parks Board would like direction from the Council on if Ferrari Park is still an option they should move forward with, or if that is not an option. The Board would also like input on if the recirculating water system seems appropriate to the Council or if fresh flow and discharge is better. Keep in mind that during the course of a season it is estimated that a fresh flow system would use approximately 1.2 million gallons of water and would need to be discharged into a sewer system of some type.

The Parks Board does have concerns with locating the park in a different area because there could be added costs. In the event of additional costs they have asked the Council to cover any additional costs above \$100,000 (\$50,000 from budget and \$50,000 from donations).




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**Background:** During the 3/5/2018 City Council meeting the Council approved moving forward with a bid notification for the proposed South Derby Lane Paving project. In FY2018 the budgeted amount for this project is \$875,000 and a new engineers estimate was provided from Greg in the amount of \$639,423.05. The engineers estimate is attached.

Bids were opened on 3/29/2018 at 10:00am. There were 2 bids received.
